



On Saturday 28 March over 30 young people gathered together at St Peter's Anglican church for a night of fun and fellowship. It was a great opportunity for staff and leaders to catch up with our young campers and encourage them. They had lots of fun playing games and enjoyed being together.



#### TRAINING DAY


We love catching up and training volunteers to nurture and teach children and youth about Jesus.

50 people came to the SU ACT Children and Youth Ministry Training Day on 20 March. Excitingly at lunch Baptists, Anglicans, Catholics and Pentecostals were talking about how we can improve our ministry for children and youth.

One church brought along all their volunteers to do our Childsafe training program in order to keep children and vulnerable people safe in their church.

Those who attended loved the hands-on and practical workshops on offer with topics such as how to run a small group, healthy group dynamics, dealing with curly questions, giving a powerful testimony, helping children with neurodiversity, trauma, and young people who self-harm.





In the second week of the school holidays, 52 young people and 20 leaders gathered at Wee Jasper to hear from speaker Matt Sweeny about God's great love in Romans 5:8. Many of the older campers were really encouraged by this message and were eager to dig deep into the scriptures to explore how they could apply it to their lives outside of camp.

Campfire time is always an incredibly valuable part of WWJ. The campfire provides a peaceful place for campers and leaders to rest at the end of a busy day and reflect on what God has been teaching them. As the camp progresses, it is also a space where campers feel safe and loved enough to open up and be vulnerable about their struggles.

This year, campers started opening up earlier in the week than usual. This was an incredible blessing, because it meant that the leaders had more time to listen and walk alongside campers as they shared some challenging issues.

The leaders who served on WWJ also really valued the opportunity to share their testimonies and encourage the campers to persist and grow in their faith. Already, we are seeing the fruit of these conversations and relationships; several of the older campers are keen to be junior leaders at a primary camp in the Spring!
